**SANTA MONICA-MALIBU EDUCATION FOUNDATION'S
PIER PARTY RAISES \$125,000**

Event Benefits All Schools in the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District

Santa Monica, CA, May 4 – The Santa Monica-Malibu Education Foundation (SMMEF) today announced that Pier Party, its largest annual community fundraising event, raised \$125,000. Proceeds from the event, which took place on Sunday, April 26 at Pacific Park on the historic Santa Monica Pier, will support SMMEF-funded programs in the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District. Income for the event came from ticket sales, an online auction and 35 corporate sponsors.

Over 1,500 people attended Pier Party, a private event that included rides, games, a live DJ, animals from the Santa Monica Pier Aquarium, Santa Monica Police officers, interactive games by Marbles: The Brain Store, a mime and magician, arts and crafts run by P.S. Arts, and drawing machines. TREATS Frozen Yogurt & Ice Bar sold yogurt and sorbet to attendees, with 100% of proceeds going to SMMEF, and Brad Simpson and Stacy White of Partner's Trust provided give aways and ran a raffle for attendees.

The Pier Party VIP event featured a breakfast reception and brunch tastings from favorite restaurants, including: Caffe Luxxe, FIG, Pier Burger, Border Grill, Truxton's, Sonoma Wine Garden, Loews Santa Monica Beach Hotel and Cookie Good.

Community leaders, including State Senator Ben Allen, Superintendent Sandra Lyon, Santa Monica Mayor Kevin McKeown, Mayor Pro Tempore Tony Vazquez, City Councilmember Ted Winterer, and SMMUSD School Board members Laurie Lieberman, Craig Foster, Maria Leon-Vazquez, and Ralph Mechur enjoyed the event.

"This was a beautiful community event," shared Kathleen Rawson, President of the SMMEF Board of Directors and CEO of Downtown Santa Monica. "With 35 corporate sponsors, over 100 volunteers, 8 restaurants donating food for the VIP event, and over 1,500 community members enjoying fun in the sun on the Pier, Pier Party is the perfect example of our community coming together to support our students."
