It was another great year for our students. Thanks to your donations, academics, arts and athletics were present in our schools, enhancing our children's education!

This, our annual Gratitude Report for donors, outlines all of the wonderful opportunities you helped make happen for our Santa Monica public school students. From Academic Enrichment Grants, which gave teachers the chance to bring exciting projects to their classrooms; to sorely needed athletic equipment and uniforms; to an array of art offerings for students in TK through 12th grade, every student was touched by your gift.

This past year saw an unprecedented level of Ed Foundation investment in competitive school sports. What rang true all year was this: your generosity and commitment to every child in Santa Monica's public schools. THANK YOU!

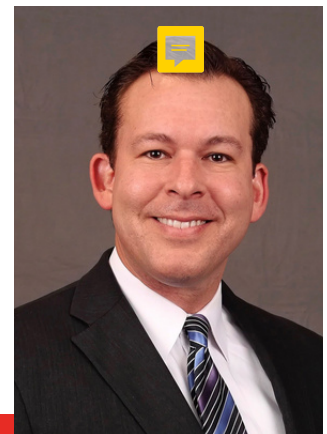

# Your Dollars at Work...

## ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT GRANTS

Last year, the Ed Foundation brought back its Academic Enrichment Grants program for our Santa Monica teachers for the first time since 2012. During the 2022-2023 school year, we awarded grants to teachers for a total of \$30,000, thanks to you!

The Ed Foundation's Academic Enrichment Grants give Santa Monica teachers an opportunity to enrich their classrooms with innovative programs, projects and field trips. Teachers can apply for individual grants for up to \$1,000 and they can also apply for Super Grants for up to \$5,000. These Super Grants are only awarded to collaborative teams (within one school, one grade level, one core, one department or one house) to encourage innovation and collaboration between teachers.



Birdhouse Project

We were thrilled to see so many exciting projects and programs benefitting our students! One middle school purchased VR headsets so that students could go on "field trips" anywhere in the world. A Samohi teacher bought a set of new books focused on Japanese literature that is now a core part of his curriculum for the coming years. And a group of elementary school teachers wanted to bring more culturally relevant books to their school so that every child could see themselves in these books.

## HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETICS

Thanks to a grant the Ed Foundation secured from an anonymous donor, Samohi athletics were given a boost last year! The Samohi athletic department was able to hire a strength and conditioning coach and also purchase a number of items to enhance the department, including: team uniforms; tournament fees; replacement equipment for sports teams; and a new HUDL system, which films players for coaches to review key plays and give feedback.

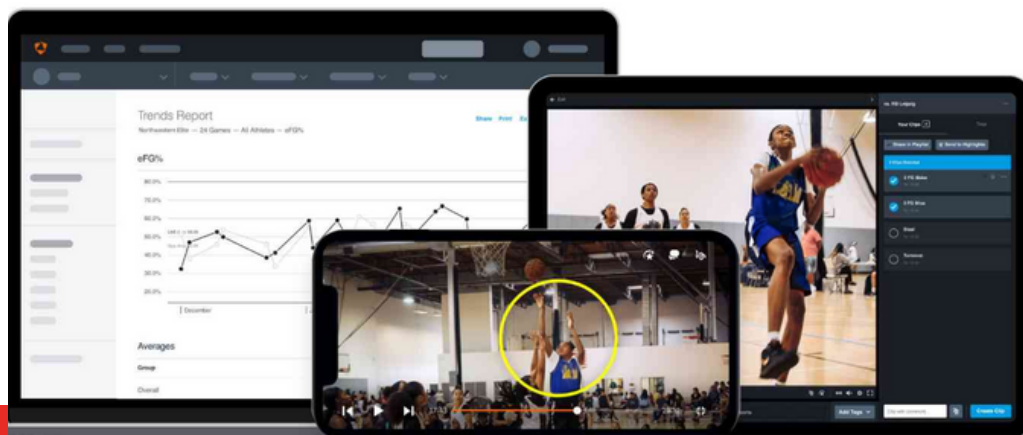

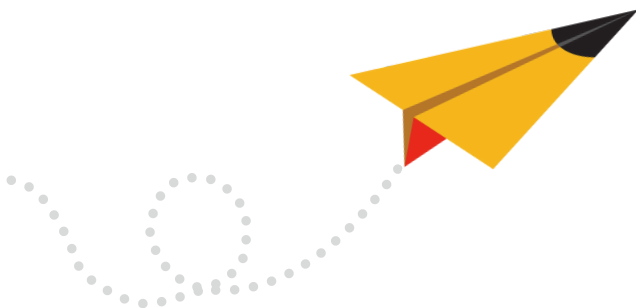
In 2022-2023, students in the Lincoln Theater Program performed in "Peter Pan" and students from JAMS/SMASH Theatre Company performed in "Grease."



JAMS/SMASH Theatre - "Grease"

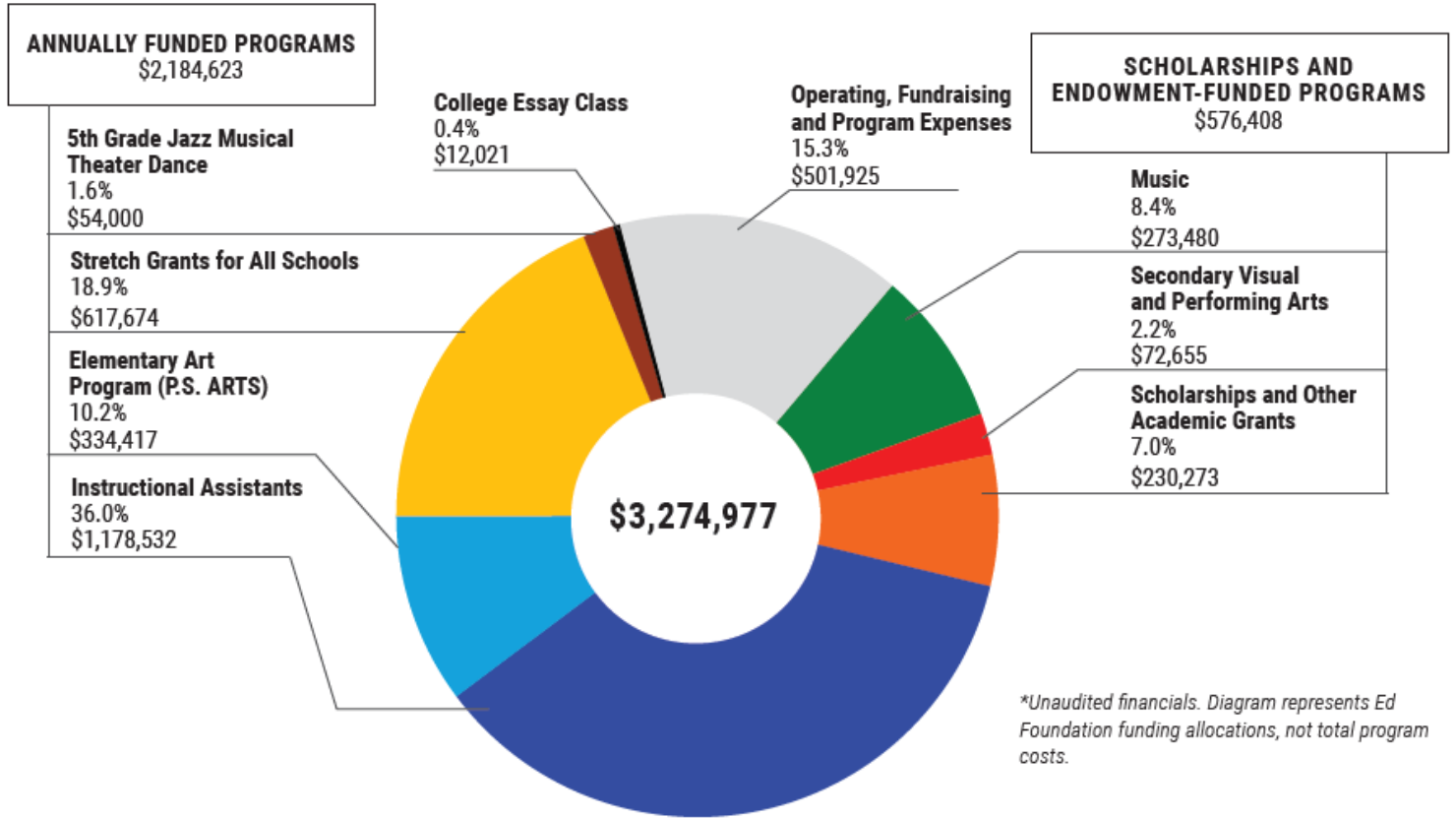


Lincoln Theater - "Peter Pan"

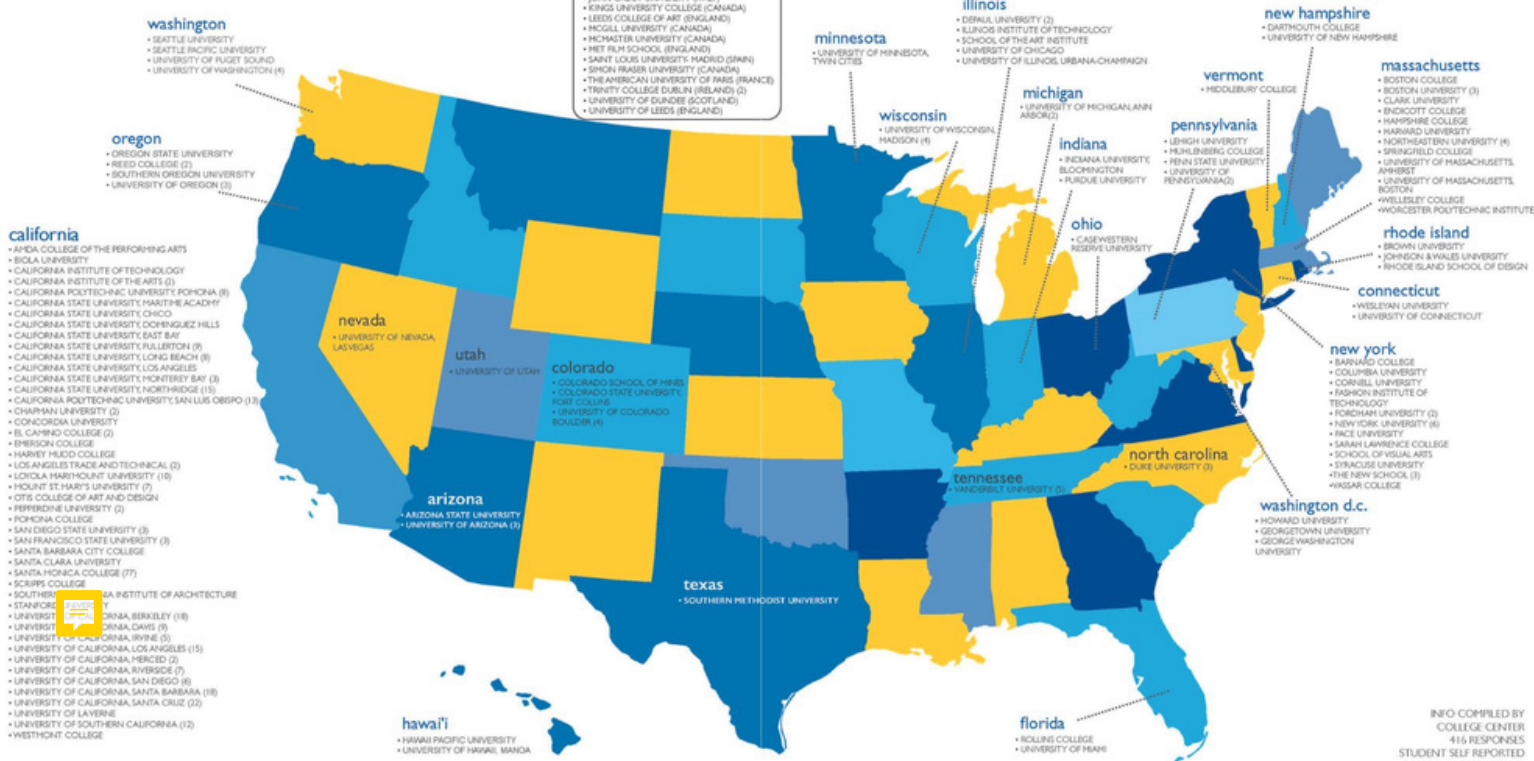

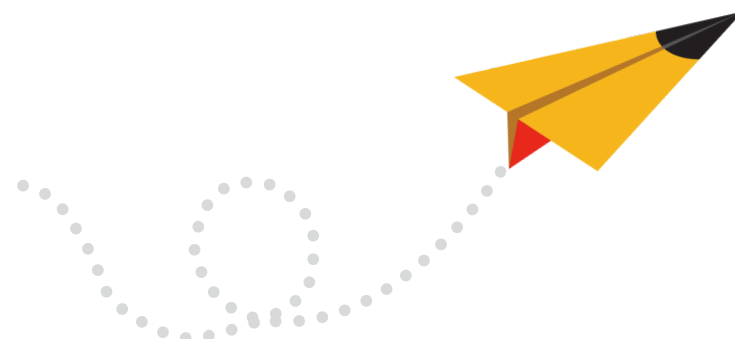
